Dr. Bogan is a licensed psychologist with extensive experience working with college students. For over ten years, she served as the director of the Florida A&M University (FAMU) counseling center. In this capacity, she provided clinical and administrative oversight of the center and consulted with parents, staff and administration about student mental health issues, treatment, and classroom management. She has also consulted with universities on how to address complex cultural matters in higher education management.

Over the last thirty years, her clinical experience has included working in outpatient, inpatient, and faith-based settings with a wide variety of patients. She is a tenured professor in the Department of Psychology at FAMU where she coordinates the internship program for master's level students and directs research and assessment for the College of Social Sciences, Arts and Humanities. Her clinical practice and educational philosophy focus on utilizing cultural strengths for mental health.

After graduating from Emory University, she earned her PhD in clinical psychology from the University of Georgia and completed her internship at the Baylor College of Medicine. She is a member of the American Psychological Association and the Association of Black Psychologists.
